### **Overview and Background**

- Digital infrastructure is critical to the economy of Cumbria.
- The Cumbria-wide Digital Infrastructure Strategy 2020-2025 is in place for broadband and mobile infrastructure.
- The strategy is delivered across the county by Connecting Cumbria which values
  2012 to deliver the superfast broadband programme.
- Connecting Cumbria leads the Digital Borderlands programme including th Innovation Regions project.
- The strategy aims to ensure that no one and no place is left behind.





## Digital Infrastructure Strategy

- Helping communities to receive gigabit connectivity through voucher funde
- Cumbria is a regional pilot for Project Gigabit to deliver gigabit capable bro where there is no commercial provision or community voucher projects plant
  - Building Digital UK, a part of the Department for Science, Innovation as Technology holds a £108m contract with Fibrus to provide full fibre to 59,000 properties.
- Work with the Shared Rural Network and Home Office 4G mobile programmaximise investment in Cumbria.
- Lead the Borderlands 5G Innovation Regions programme
  - Windermere 5G Ferry
